 - Put the full direct quote or start of the quote with ellipses (...) for longer quotes
 - Put author's last name, Miller, and page number in parentheses after quotes.
 - Put period after parentheses.
- Explanation
 - Explain who said the quote to whom, when
 - What is the importance of the quote
